Dear Parent:

The New York State Department of Health Bureau of Early Intervention (NYS DOH BEI) and the Family Initiative Coordination Services Project at Just Kids Early Childhood Learning Center are sponsoring an *Early Intervention Partners Training Project* in the Central Region this spring for parents of infants and toddlers with disabilities currently receiving early intervention services. The training is also for parent members of the Local Early Intervention Coordinating Council (LEICC) and its committees.

The *Early Intervention Partners Training Project* helps parents of young children with disabilities become involved in Early Intervention Program leadership activities. The training sessions provide information, resources, and skill-building activities designed to increase parent advocacy and leadership skills. Parents are encouraged to form working partnerships with early intervention professionals and policymakers.

The training sessions will help parents of infants and toddlers with disabilities gain a better understanding of the Early Intervention Program (EIP). Parents who are accepted to attend will receive information about early intervention laws and regulations, Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) development, family assessment, natural environments, the history of the disability movement, individual leadership goals, clinical practice guidelines, parent rights, information regarding Early Intervention Coordinating Councils (EICC), opportunities for parent involvement and the process of transitioning out of the Early Intervention Program.

We are inviting you to apply to participate in this training program. The training program is *free of charge*, and all meals, training materials, and overnight accommodations are provided at no cost. A very limited amount of funding is available to assist parents in need of support for child care and travel expenses. Prior approval by the Family Initiative Coordinator is required for those needing assistance.

Pre-recorded video: Prior to Session 1, participants will receive a link to view a short video about early intervention which they may watch from a computer or a mobile device anytime before the Session 1 web-based training.

Session I is a web-based training, presented as an interactive webinar titled, IFSP Functional Outcomes, to be viewed from a personal computer or mobile device.

Session II meets for a two-day, in-person training and includes an optional overnight stay at the Hampton Inn & Suites Syracuse, North Airport Area, 1305 Buckley Road, North Syracuse, NY 13212. Please see the next page for information on the dates and times of sessions.
